VAFF is the longest running Asian film festival in Canada. It was founded in 1995 and debuted in September 1997. Since then, tens of thousands of film lovers have experienced a diverse selection of North American-Asian and international films.

Each year VAFF attracts close to 5,000 audience members over its four-day festival and year round events. It also reaches many more through word of mouth, pre-festival events, and traditional and social media throughout the year.

In 2020 almost every regional, national and international film festival pivoted to offer programs online and VAFF was no exception. From these learnings, VAFF has adapted and expanded to become a hybrid film festival with both in person and virtural screenings.

VAFF is mostly organized and produced by a group of dedicated volunteers, and is made possible by generous financial support from corporate sponsors, public funders and private donors.

VAFF envisions a world where North American Asian actors and filmmakers have the resources and opportunities to shape mainstream culture in a powerful and positive way.

MISSION

VAFF is dedicated to promoting and celebrating the diversity and depth of Asian culture and identity in film and media, and to help North American Asian actors and filmmakers more authentically and more powerfully define and express themselves on screen.

Through its annual film festival and many other programs and events hosted in Vancouver, VAFF's mission is to engage in, support and amplify Asian presence in film and television.

VAFF celebrates its 27th edition this year from November 2 to 12, 2023. VAFF is going to be a hybrid affair taking place over 11 days and counting. The extended festival kicks off with 4 days of in-person events (November 2-5), followed by 7 days of online programs (November 6-12), before one final live program and the festival's closing awards ceremony on November 12. The eleven-day celebration will highlight an array of unique and outstanding talent, with both emerging and established Asian Canadian and Asian American writers, producers, and directors showcasing their latest work. 1. Is Racialized Storytelling Going Mainstream? (12pm - 12:45pm)

VAFF has gathered this distinguished panel of film festival and entertainment industry professionals from the North American Asian communities to discuss the most urgent challenges for racialized people working or aspiring to work in the screen industry in BC and across North America post COVID. Panelists will provide insights from an organizational and industry perspective to discuss the future of Asian film festivals given the shift towards more mainstream acceptance. Stats Canada is predicting a rapid change towards a greater racialized population over the next twenty years, making this a critical time to engage more racialized cast and crew through Panels and Workshops like this to include their voices are included with shaping the future of this industry ensuring multiculturalism, diversity, and inclusivity are key component while combating racism and racist barriers.

2. IATSE Lunch Meet and Greet (12:45pm - 1:30pm)

Come enjoy a light lunch and networking with some established IATSE 891 members and staff to learn more about organizing and what the union offers for its members and ways to enter the industry. Ideal for the zoom participants wanting to meet in real life.

3. Increasing BIPOC Creatives In Front and Behind the Camera Workshop (1:45pm - 3:00pm)

Historically racialized people faced significant barriers to entry creating a lack of representation in the screen industry at large. This pronounced under representation and below average years of experience in the industry have created greater hardships for BIPOC creatives during the recent writers and ongoing actor strikes. As well, there are many supports focusing on becoming a director or an actor, but much less for the wide range of other positions and opportunities in the screen industry that may not be receiving the same level of advocacy or opportunity. This community engagement will lay the foundation for developing a deep understanding of these challenges and opportunities for all racialized creatives striving to enter all aspects of the screen industry.



Hanna Cho is Interim ED of RESO, and an inveterate convenor, cultural strategist, and community advocate. She is passionate about bringing people, ideas, and cultures together. A multidisciplinary cultural strategist and producer, she brings nearly two decades of experience from interactive media production, museums, and community engagement to her current role at RESO. From her policy roots as a digital humanities researcher, to her cultural leadership experience, or her community-based work as a cofounder of a community wireless network (Wireless Toronto) Hanna strives to enliven and empower conversations around equity through creativity, care, and action.



Alan Wong is an award-winning, multi-disciplinary artist and creative professional. A seasoned performer of stage and screen, Alan has also worked in film and television in various technical and administrative roles behind the camera, as well as corporately for Buffalo Gal Pictures, a successful production company based in Winnipeg. He is the founder and President of FascinAsian, a film festival dedicated to celebrating the stories of the Asian diaspora in the prairies, with events in Winnipeg and Calgary.



Barbara Lee has spent over twenty-five years as a community advocate and organizer of events to increase opportunities for Canadian Asian artists in mainstream music, film, tv and media. She is the Founder of the Vancouver Asian Film Festival (VAFF). Canada's oldest Asian film festival, Racial Equity Screen Office (RESO) and Elimin8Hate.org. Barbara has built an ecosystem of programs and organizations to address systemic barriers in the screen industry.



Michelle K. Sugihara is the Executive Director of CAPE (Coalition of Asian Pacifics in Entertainment). She is also an entertainment attorney, film producer, and adjunct professor for the Claremont Colleges' Intercollegiate Department of Asian American Studies. She is also an associate member of Cold Tofu, the nation's premier Asian American comedy improv and sketch group. An avid public speaker, Michelle speaks and teaches across the country on various topics including Representation in Media; Women in Entertainment; Diversity and Inclusion; Leadership; and Improv for Non-Actors.



Avi Grewal is an accomplished leader in the intersection of business, arts, and film, currently working within the Media and Entertainment realm at the Royal Bank of Canada. As an executive with Canada's largest bank, she navigates the intricate landscape of film and television production financing, collaborating with studios, animation houses, and publishing firms. Notably, Avi champions emerging producers through RBC's BIPOC Emerging Producer Program, facilitating access to bank funding.

MAMM OVERVIEW 2023

The 18th Mighty Asian Moviemaking Marathon (MAMM18) was another successful, record breaking year that concluded with a sold-out Screening Gala and Awards Presentation at the Vancouver Playhouse on August 26, 2023. We had a fantastic lineup with an impressive range of genres including comedy, fantasy, action, horror, drama and first ever stop motion film. We featured the most gender-diverse stories and filmmakers. Submissions continued to grow, including ones from the East Coast. We also had our youngest ever Director to compete at the age of 15 this year! And, our gala tickets were sold out in less than a week.

Being VAFF's annual short film-making competition, MAMM aims to foster and showcase emerging Asian and mixed Asian filmmakers. Eight 10 min Shorts and Eight 1 min. Ultra Shorts are selected through pitching. A masterclass-level MAMMentorship program is provided leading up to a 10-day moviemaking marathon, culminating in the premiere screening and awards announcement.




2023 has been marked by significant achievements including:

Expanding Partnerships: Broadening our partnership with the Vancouver Canucks beyond in-game celebrations to create educational curriculum fostering inclusive workplaces that empower and amplify the voices of Asian Canadians;

Building Bridges: Forging connections beyond borders and communities including Chinatowns across North America, racial equity groups representing a diverse spectrum of Canadians, and Asian American advocacy groups, among others;

Ground-breaking Initiatives: Achieving a massive step forward with Microsoft reaching out to adopt our "Reclaim Your Name: Your Name is Not a Typo" dictionary into their ongoing Microsoft 365 updates. This ground-breaking collaboration eliminates the inequitable red-lining of Asian names in their Office suite. This impact of this initiative has been nothing short of remarkable, garnering global recognition including receiving the prestigious Webby award (the global internet awards), 2 Sabre awards (among the most prominent accolades in the North American PR industry), and was the standout initiative at Strategy's 101st Marketing Awards for Canadian creatives, winning 10 Golds awards and 2 Best In Show awards in the Multicultural and Public Service categories. Furthermore, our initiative was recognized on 2023 Fast Company's World Changing Ideas list.





This has been another momentous year and we are excited to cap off this record-breaking year by supporting the Vancouver Asian Film Festival to showcase films that celebrate and highlight the Asian Canadian diaspora.

VAFF @ EAST BY NORTHWEST (EXNW) GLOBAL SUMMIT

This past July, the Racial Equity Screen Office (RESO) presented its inaugural marquee event East by Northwest (EXNW) Global Summit at the JW Marriott Parq Hotel with its partner Gold House, the leading the Asian American Native Hawaiian and Pacific Islander cultural ecosystem that unites, invests in, and champions AANHPI content and companies.

VAFF Takeover of EXNW included sending the largest delegation to attend EXNW and Regina Leung, VAFF's Director of Industry worked closely with RESO's team to organize the Industry pitch sessions at 4 Michelin star and recommended restaurants (Vij's, Phnom Penh, iDen & Quanjude Beijing Duck House and Ahn and Chi) - Thank you to these restaurants for being so welcoming. The executive decision makers included Janice Chua from Imagine Entertainment, Brian Hamilton and Nicolle Rufino from Omnifilm Entertainment, Art Birzneck from Birch Tree Entertainment and Patrice Ramsay from Knowledge Network. Virtual pitches included Takashi Cheng from ChimeTV and Georgia Shearman from Bell Media. Many of VAFF delegates were able take advantage of these exclusive networking opportunities and we can't wait to see the deals that come out of these pitches and relationships. EXNW also made space for the Elimin8Hate team to amplify the work they have been doing throughout the year.



Updates from the RESO and VAFF advocacy work for mandated racial equity targets

RESO and VAFF's advocacy resulted in Knowledge Network mandates of 50% funding for BPOC commissioning projects and KN recently announced the greenlighting of a new slate of compelling documentaries with racialized filmmakers leading 3 of the 4 documentaries.

RESO's 2022 equity report "National Film Board of Whose Canada?" <u>https://www.reso-ca.org/news</u> with VAFF support, resulted in the National Film Board of Canada's recent announcement of its commitment that "By March 31, 2025, the NFB commits that more than 30% of its current production and co-production projects will be made by filmmakers/artists who identify as Black and People of Colour (BPOC). This figure represents a minimum: the NFB is aiming for more but certainly not less than this objective." <u>https://production.nfbonf.ca/en/equity/</u>

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




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
